ITEM	DESCRIPTION	YES/ NO/NA
<b>Title</b>	Mentions the area of focus	
<b>Key words</b>	2 to 5 key words (included from MeSH) that identify areas covered	
<b>Word count</b>	Maximum word count of text does not exceed 1300	
<b>Abstract</b>	Unstructured with maximum word count of 150	
	Uniqueness of this case and its importance in medical literature mentioned	
	Main symptoms of the patient and the important clinical findings given	
	Main diagnoses, therapeutics interventions, and outcomes mentioned	
	Conclusion— primary “take-home” message from this case given	
<b>Introduction</b>	Includes one or two paragraphs summarizing why this case is unique with references	
<b>Patient Information</b>	Demographic and other patient specific information given	
	Main symptoms of the patient along with medical, family and psychosocial history given	
<b>Timeline</b>	Important information from patient's history organized as timeline	
<b>Clinical findings</b>	Relevant physical examination (PE) and other significant clinical findings described	
<b>Diagnostic Assessment</b>	Diagnostic methods described in detail along with reasoning and diagnostic challenges	
<b>Therapeutic Intervention</b>	Type of intervention along with its administration given	
<b>Follow-up and outcomes</b>	Clinician and patient assessed outcomes given	
	Intervention adherence and tolerability and how it was assessed clearly mentioned	
	Adverse and un anticipated events mentioned	
<b>Discussion</b>	Strengths and limitations in approach to this case mentioned	
	Discussion of relevant medical literature	
	Conclusion and primary take away lesson of this case report given	
<b>References</b>	10-12 references given in Vancouver style of referencing	
<b>Figures/Tables/ Photographs</b>	Maximum 4	
<b>Informed Consent</b>	Written informed consent from patient/guardian/next of kin (Copy attached)	
<b>Confidentiality</b>	Protection is given against disclosing identity of the patient	
	Where possible, case report is reviewed by the individual to permit editing or removal of any confidential or compromising material
